Hastings Contemporary champions modern and contemporary art. An ambitious programme of temporary exhibitions includes work by important Modern British artists, internationally celebrated artists, and emerging practitioners. Hastings Contemporary has developed a reputation for its focus on painting and on Modern British art. The gallery sits among Hasting's famous net huts, overlooking the largest beach-launched fishing fleet in Europe.

We nurture creative relationships with artists and our community. We offer a welcoming space for families to explore our exhibitions and quiet spaces for creativity for those who are neurodivergent; we facilitate workshops and courses to energise people to get creative and to gain skills and knowledge to pursue careers in the arts. We also work extensively with local schools. We want local families to feel that Hastings Contemporary is a space where they can create, as well as to visit, reinforcing our ambition of creating a shared cultural space for our community. We want art to matter more to more people.

### The Role

Hastings Contemporary is seeking to increase its roster of freelance creative facilitators to deliver on our exciting programme of public events and to feed into the future development of this programme. We are looking for practitioners with strong creative skills and an interest in community engagement.

We are particularly interested in applications from people from backgrounds which are underrepresented in the museums and galleries sector, including people from low-income backgrounds, people with disabilities and people from Black, Asian and ethnically diverse backgrounds.
